



Development of railways in Java during the colonial period





Rail networks 1880-






INDONESIAN CORE-PERIPHERY MODEL, 2005

LEARNING FROM INDONESIAN HISTO-GEOGRAPHY: WHAT MAKES GROWTH CENTERS WORKING



- 1. City's role in regional development: Central Place vs. Growth Center
- 2. Growth center by design (supply driven) vs. by nature (demand driven)
- 3. Cities grow together with hinterlands: growth center's hinterlands, and relations between them (backwash/spread?), need to be well defined
- 4. Disruption to history, geographical solution, institutional rearrangement
