Upward trend of Global and Indonesian Tension, there are many studies about conflict, but the results are divergent. Ethnic Diversity or Income Gap?




Indonesia has high intensity

## **ECONOMIC THEORIZING OF CONFLICT**

Conflict can be defined as the use of resources for creating or defending against appropriation. Within each of these areas, **economic agents allocate resources** toward the **defense and coercive appropriation of assets**.
